False Hopes - Matthew 3:1-11 Rev. Dr. Ernest Brodie Jr.

We all make decisions and choices. How do we know if we made the right ones? The most important choice of all is choosing the right religion, since this involves eternal consequences. As Christians, we understand it is not a religion but a relationship with Christ that is needed. Today a minefield of religious confusion abounds. This was so in the days of Jesus also. Matthew 3:1 offers hope: "In those days came, John the Baptist," the forerunner of the Messiah.

- The Man (Matthew 3:1). John the Baptist was the miracle child born to Zacharias and Elisabeth (Luke 1). He was called the forerunner or herald for Jesus (Matthew 3:3, Isaiah 40:3, Malachi 3:1).
- The Message (Matthew 3:2a). People from all around the region went to hear John preach a message of repentance. He was preaching to the Jews. Many were religious, but not righteous and saw no need to repent.
- The Mandate (Matthew 3:7-12). The Pharisees and Sadducees were trusting in and promoting false hope through their religious practices and through their heritage as the children of Abraham. John told them not to think that because they were of Abraham they were qualified for God's Kingdom. God's wrath will come upon those who have not repented (Matthew 3:7, 10).
- The Messiah (Matthew 3:11). "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance. but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire." John spoke of Jesus. "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and fire." The Holy Ghost is given to believers at the moment of salvation (2 Corinthians 1:22, Ephesians 1:13). Fire is prepared for those who refuse to come to Christ (verse 12).

Where is your hope? Are you religious or righteous? You can know that you are saved and will spend eternity with Christ (1 John 5:13).
