Love vs. Hate **Rev. Dr. Ernest Brodie Jr.**

I do believe that there are times when Christians should become angry and upset. We should become angry over sin while not sinning. It may even be sinful to not become angry when we see abuse, neglect, or injustice. Please note that I am writing about real evil that exists in the world. Jesus cleansed the Temple twice because the actions of the religious leaders desecrated what should have been a house of prayer. I would also say that we cannot dwell in the land of anger without it taking hold of us. In my opinion, there are two motivating factors which come from our emotions. These are love and hate. While both motivate and are used to stir people up at churches, as well as at political rallies, hate is like riding a mean bull. Sooner or later it will be out of control. It may even turn and stomp you after you are thrown off. Anger is destructive, cruel, unreasonable, and even hurtful. Love provides a steadfast and easy way to manage the ride. It motivates people long after anger subsides. It causes people to think. I can get a crowd and motivate people much faster using hate than love; however, to transform lives, love must be at the center of every message.
