The Triumphal Entry of Christ into Jerusalem - Mark 11:1-11 **Rev. Dr. Ernest Brodie Jr.**

The anticipation was building. Jesus had traveled from one end of Israel to the other preaching, teaching, training, healing, casting out demons, and challenging the thoughts of the religious leaders of the day. The disciples understood something big was about to happen. They could feel it. They could hear it in Christ's teaching. They could see it on His face.

The Kingdom of God was at hand. As the disciples and Jesus approached Jerusalem, the anticipation of something big was almost overwhelming. Jesus attempted to remind the disciples that He was going to Jerusalem to die (Mark 10:32-34). He was going to Jerusalem to make an atonement for sin. He sent two of the disciples to bring a colt for Him to ride into the city.

The events of Mark 11:1-11 reveal several things about Jesus. First, Jesus exercised divine knowledge by describing what will take place before it does (Mark 11:1-6). Second, Jesus exercised authority over nature by riding an animal which was never ridden before (Mark 11:7). Third, Jesus exercised humility by riding an animal of no sacrificial significance. He rode a lowly donkey.

Mark 11:9-10 shows that the crowd goes wild with anticipation. Jesus, by riding a colt into the city through the Eastern Gate during Passover week, publicly declared His claim to the Throne of King David. The crowd hailed Him as King with hearts full of expectations. When it became clear that these expectations would not be fulfilled at this time, the hosannas (save us now) turned to "crucify Him!" (Luke 23:20-21).

What did Jesus actually accomplish in His coming to earth? The main purpose of His work involved providing salvation and training His followers to carry on the work of the ministry. He came to provide salvation to all people (Romans 10:9-13). Have you met the resurrected Christ Who came to seek and save the lost?
